


COVID-19 Safety Guidelines / Artists



As of 10th July we are pleased to be welcoming artists back to 101 Outdoor Arts Creation Space to attend residencies, labs and outdoor events. We have undertaken a full risk assessment prior to the reopening, and what follows are the guidelines and principles you will need to follow in order to visit.

Inevitably, there are going to be some changes and restrictions in order for us to ensure the safety of everyone in our organisation and we will need to ask you all to observe these guidelines to ensure a safe return to work for everyone.

Our commitments to you:



Increased and enhanced cleaning regimes with emphasis on regular touchpoints



Airflow will be increased where possible throughout the building



Social distancing measures will be in place along with controlled access to buildings




We will work with you to support best practice around your activity in line with Gov. Guidance




Cleaning materials have been provided so that everybody can clean touchpoints and shared equipment



A new Covid Working Group has been set-up to regularly review risk assessments



We will implement procedures for suspected or confirmed COVID cases



We will schedule activity and facilities at 101 to minimise shared occupancy of spaces

Your daily health check:

- Please agree your rehearsal and production schedule with the Head of 101 and inform them of any changes
- 2m social distancing (or 1m + PPE) must be observed between your company and other people in the building at all times. If you are forming a 'bubble' your risk mitigation must be clearly outlined in your risk assessment
- Everybody must wash their hands for a minimum of 20 seconds or use hand sanitiser on arrival and on a regular basis thereafter
- Everybody to identify and wipe down/clean equipment and touch points in communal areas after use (eg: Key to building, kitchen equipment, shared sink, toilet handles)
- Everybody working in the building must be self-certified as healthy (ie not displaying any of the coronavirus symptoms and have not been in contact with others known to have had the virus within the last 14 days) we would recommend taking your temperature and ensuring it is below 37.8 degrees before entering the building
- Anyone experiencing coronavirus symptoms whilst at 101 must go home, along with their whole company, immediately, Please inform the Head of 101 by email or phone and follow all government guidelines including applying for a virus test
- In the event of a positive test, you must inform The Head of 101 immediately so that NHS Test & Trace can begin
